Re: United Nations Security Council Resolutions (UNSCR) 1970 (2011) Pursuant to the Anti-Terrorism (Amendment) Act, 2019 and International Obligations (Economic and Ancillary Measures) (Amendment) Act, 2019

Pursuant to section 43 and 44 of the Anti-Terrorism (Amendment) Act, 2019 and section 3A of the International Obligations (Economic and Ancillary Measures) (Amendment) Act, 2019 (“IOEAMA”) the National Identified Risk Framework Coordinator has requested that the Insurance Commission of The Bahamas (“the Commission”) circulate the following Notice regarding Libya.

Please note that the Security Council Committee pursuant to resolution 1970 (2011) enacted amendments with strikethrough and underline in the entry on its Sanctions List of individuals and entities regarding Libya. The press release can be found at either of the links listed below:

Licensees are required to take note of the amendments noted in the press release. Licensees should also conduct immediate searches of their database and register of beneficial owners to determine whether there is any information in relation to individual designated by the sanctions committee and take any necessary action.

Companies must report any “Hits” to the Financial Intelligence Unit and the Office of the Attorney General immediately. Companies are also required to notify the Commission of nil results, in writing, regarding Libya.
